It is my pleasure to give an update on what is happening (old and new) in the Anglican Student Ministry. As someone who spent as many years in post-secondary studies as I did in grade school, I look forward to being back on campus in the fall and taking in the academic air, connecting with students and interacting with my colleagues. If there is one word to describe the chaplaincy role for Anglican Student Ministry it would be, collaboration. In particular there are four main partnerships that make up Anglican Student Ministry on Campus.

Interfaith Chaplains Association at the University of Alberta (IFCA): IFCA consists of chaplains from many faith backgrounds (Wiccan, Muslim, Jewish, and a number of Christian denominations). It is our purpose to serve "the university from the understanding that life, including academic life, is a spiritual journey." Together we participate in joint events on campus such as the International Students Lunch, pancake lunch, and the Advent Lessons and Carols service at the Winspear. <u>Ministry</u> and <u>Anglican Student Ministry</u>. Together, <u>the Rev. St. Aiden's House: Straight from St. Georg's webpage, "St. Aidan's House is an intentional Christian community for students in Edmonton. Each year 5 students are able to live in the former rectory of St. George's while they attend the U of A or another educational institution in the city. Together they commit to living in community with an emphasis on prayer, hospitality and service." Over the next academic year, the Rev. Alex Meek and I will be co-leading the house mentoring them in worship, prayer, study, and hospitality.
